Dear Grant Applicant(s):

Thank you for your interest in applying for a community grant for your Lowry project or program! The intent of the Community Grant Program is to redirect funds into the community for projects that will enrich life at Lowry.

Grants are awarded in amounts ranging from \$250 to \$2,500. The Lowry Foundation values collaborative efforts and strongly favors applications that clearly demonstrate how they serve the Lowry Community through programs of artistic, cultural, educational, historic, recreational and scientific value.

What we look for...

In reviewing proposals for funding, the Lowry Foundation looks for projects that:

- Promote community assets and meet well-defined community needs
- Promote volunteer and community involvement
- Encourage cooperation and collaboration
- Assist non-profit agencies in serving the Lowry community
- Encourage programs and projects of artistic, educational, cultural, historical, and recreational nature
- **Show the ability to leverage other funding sources**

What we do not fund...

- Endowments
 - Capital campaigns
 - Special events
 - Fundraising
 - Religious purposes
 - Political Lobbying
 - Projects that do not specifically serve the Lowry community
 - *Landscaping projects, the LCMA implements a landscaping grant program*
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HOW TO APPLY:

Please email or submit one original and one copy of the attachments required. Upon submission, applications will be reviewed by the Community Grants Sub-Committee of the Foundation and recommendations will be made to the Foundation Board of Directors for final approval. Checks will be issued within 30 days of notification. Grant recipients will be notified in writing no later than November 30th, 2021.

Grant applications are due on October 22nd, 2021.

The Lowry Foundation requires grant recipients complete an acceptance form upon receiving a check. The Foundation also asks grant recipients to provide appropriate acknowledgment of the Lowry Foundation's Community Grant Program funding of their project in publications, press announcements and other activities.

Applications must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. October 22nd, 2021. 1. Narrative

Please include a narrative containing the following information in the order listed. Please do not exceed three pages.

- Purpose of Grant
____ Need for this project in the Lowry Community,
____ Neighborhood involvement and support for the program,
____ Timetable for implementation.
- Evaluation
____ Describe the expected results and criteria for measuring the success of the project. The Lowry Foundation requires that grant recipients attend a Board of Directors meeting (held the first Friday of each month) with examples of the completed project: i.e., story boards, narrative portfolio, etc. during the year in which the grant was received.

2. Finances

____ Information on how you will spend any funds awarded, proposed budget (using professional estimates for goods and services) and what support, financial or in-kind you have applied for from other sources.

3. Scope of Project

____ List of organizations and individuals involved in the program or project through collaboration, volunteers, etc.
____ Letter of support from individuals, businesses or organization affected by the project or program.

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
